

DO YOU (A CHILDMINDER) OR A MEMBER OF YOUR HOUSEHOLD HAVE COVID-19 SYMPTOMS?

NO

Your setting can remain open as normal

YES

If you (a childminder) or a member of your household have symptoms of COVID-19 you will be unable to open your setting.

The childminder or household member begins a 10 day isolation and must get a test. Any other household members will now start a 10 day isolation. The setting must remain closed. Read **England** or **Wales** guidance.

Was the test positive?

YES

NO

Any children and staff who came into contact with the childminder or household member must now self-isolate for 10 days. Their families do not need to self-isolate at this point. The setting should remain closed. Read **England** or **Wales** guidance.

The childminder and members of their household will remain in isolation. Report the case via the DfE helpline on 0800 046 8687 (England) or via the CIW online services (Wales). NHS Test and Trace will contact you for information on recent contacts.

The setting can now reopen as long as you or your household members have completed any necessary isolation, are well and no longer have symptoms (other than cough or loss of sense of smell/taste as these can last for weeks after the infection has gone).

NO

Have any other household members, children or staff developed symptoms during the 10 day isolation and tested positive for COVID-19?

YES

The household member, child or staff member should now isolate for 10 days from point of showing symptoms. Their families will need to self-isolate for 10 days from this point. If a member of the childminder's household has developed symptoms the setting must remain closed until after the additional self-isolation period.

From the initial positive result and from the point of reporting, the advice services and the NHS Test and Trace will trigger an investigation into close contacts. Close contacts will have to isolate for 10 days regardless of symptoms. If there are multiple cases, it may be escalated to the local health protection team who will advise the setting. This flow chart is a basic guide for this particular instance, other situations may vary. Please read Government guidance for **England** or **Wales**.
